Last Chance Survival Simulation Workshop

March 5th, 2026 from 6pm - 9pm
San Elijo Hills Recreation Center

This workshop was developed to empower residents in high-risk, wildfire prone communities, to prepare for evacuation and potential wildfire entrapments. Each year, it becomes apparent that there is a need to enhance wildfire safety and evasion training for at-risk communities.

\$10,000 Invested in a Safer San Marcos

The San Elijo Hills Fire Safe Council is proud to share that all 20 of our \$500 Home Hardening Grants have been awarded to homeowners within our Council boundaries. Thanks to the generous support of the San Diego Regional Fire Foundation, a total of \$10,000 is now being put to work to help neighbors replace combustible fencing and gates within Zone 0 (0–5 feet from the home) with safer, non-combustible materials such as steel or aluminum.

These grants prioritized homeowners on a fixed income, veterans, individuals with disabilities, those with financial need, and residents living along canyon rims, areas where

reducing ignition risk can make a meaningful difference.

Over the coming months, we look forward to sharing updates, highlighting completed projects, and showcasing the finished results as these improvements take shape across our community.

Wildfire resilience is not a one-time effort, it's a shared responsibility. By working together, one home at a time, we strengthen evacuation routes, reduce structure-to-structure risk, and help protect our homes, families, and insurance viability. Thank you to everyone who applied, supported this program, and continues to be part of making San Elijo Hills a safer place to live.
